Motion to change agenda and begin meeting with Portland Police Officer Bledsoe. All in favor.

Officer Mike Bledsoe, Portland Police Neighborhood Response Team

Police have been focusing on clearing some areas downtown of homeless and directing them to services, which may lead to more showing up in outlying areas.

Motion to Approve Agenda. Amended to allow Lisa (BES) and Jeffrey (Treasurer) to beginning of meeting. John Gibbon moved, Naomi second. All approved.

SW 19th and Taylors Ferry Green Street Project. SW 19th is an unimproved road on incline, not maintained by city, and does not have storm water management. The project will direct stormwater runoff from SW 19th into a vegetated green street planter to reduce erosion from the street. The work will include removing invasive plants and re-grading the entire area. Construction may begin in fall 2015, but likely spring 2016.

Land Use; **John Gibbon** – Proposed land division, two existing houses to become three in Arnold Creek neighborhood, within 200 feet of Markham neighborhood, across from Maricara Park. SW Corridor Plan; decisions to be made middle of next month regarding tunnel alignments.

Transportation; Jeff Monaghan – PBOT staff presented TSP major project list. Official comment period is closed. July 14th PBOT presentation to PSC, then City Counsel in the fall. Tryon-Stephens Creek Neighborhood Street Plan draft is complete. Final to be available in late summer.

Public Safety; Ron Magnus – Traffic vigil at 26th and Taylors Ferry in August. Women's Strength self-defense classes, September 9th, 16th, 23rd at MAC; Oct 10th, 17th, 24th at Stephens Creek Crossing. Refer questions to Donna Herron or Portland Police website. Community Policing Reception scheduled, Oct 29th, now accepting nominations. Police information system is being revised. Portland Police coverage has changed to a sector plan to improve flexibility.

NET; **Ron Magnus** – Saturday, testing hand held radios to adjust for seasonal foliage. Monday, quarterly meeting, reviewing Project Sasquatch.

Schools; Amanda Garcia Snell – Committee met with Zone 1 PPS Representative, Julie Esparza Brown. Ongoing planning for Techquity Fair in Fall to showcase technology in schools. Boundary changes are under review, project plan to be released late summer.
